- 4. In your own words: what is the point Jesus is making?
- 5. Mark talked about what forgiveness looks like when we've done it. Which one is hardest for you? They are: (1) I won't bring this up to you, (2) I won't bring this up to others, and (3) I won't dwell on it myself.
- 6. Mark said forgiving is not forgetting. Agree or disagree? Why?
- 7. True or False: After I forgive someone I shouldn't treat them any different. Why?
- 8. Have you ever wrestled with forgiveness? Have you been able to forgive yet?

WRAP IT UP

We can't be a Christian and an Atheist at the same time. But we can drift into an atheist lifestyle when we live like God doesn't exist. When we see our sin on Jesus, it melts our anger and gives us the power to forgive. Forgiven people forgive people.
