- 3. When it comes to Bible reading, what have you tried in the past that didn't work? What did?**
- 4. Other than reading the Bible and listening at church, what other ways can you get biblical truth into your heart and mind?** (Ex: Podcasts, music, audio books, Christian literature, audio Bibles, blogs, etc.)
- 5. What is the biggest obstacle you face to regularly reading the Bible? What suggestions can you give one another to overcome that obstacle?**
