



## Part 2: All Hands on Deck

### GET GOING

Most churches today are full of passengers: people who are seeking their own comfort. What would it look like for a church to operate like a battleship? ### DISCUSS

1. When have you been a part of a movement or project that was bigger than yourself? How did it make you feel to work with a group of people to make a difference?
2. How would you sum up the difference between a consumer and a contributor? Why do you think so many churches are full of consumers and not contributors?
3. Read Romans 12:1-8. Gratitude is always the proper motivation for serving. Why is our motivation for serving so important?
4. What are some wrong motivations that people have for serving? What happens when we serve out of the wrong motivation?
5. In verse 3 Paul warns us not to be proud and think too highly of ourselves. How can following Jesus example of serving help us keep the proper attitude toward serving?
6. Serving is all about aptitude. We don't all have the same role, but we all have some role. What would you say your gift is? How are you currently using it to serve others?
7. How has serving here at Parker Hill, or in another context, helped you grow in your relationship with God? If you're not currently serving what's stopping you?
8. What can this group do to help you take a next step into serving?
